






My Journey...








My Journey continued...

- Advertises all jobs via a central portal:








My Journey continued...

Mental Health and Eating Disorders

 Mental health = emotional and mental wellbeing (continuum)

 Depression, bipolar, schizophrenia, psychosis, eating disorders

 Admitted to hospital if posing a risk to themselves or others





My Role...

To provide dietetic assessment and advice to patients under care of mental health services.

7 wards over 3 hospitals

Inpatient assessments, outpatient clinics, group sessions and family therapy

High security wards



Dietitians in Mental Health

- Most common reasons for referral:
 - Weight gain (medication, neglect, depression)
 - Under-nourished (eating disorders, neglect)
 - Food-related psychoses
- Assessment and review
- Group sessions

Dietitians in Eating Disorders

Automatic referral to Dietitian when admitted:

- Develop meal plan
- 2. Weekly review
- 3. Weekly weights
- 4. Ward round (whole MD team) weekly
- 5. Safe weight = move towards 'maintenance' phase





Working in Mental Health

8.30 – 9.30am: Ward rounds

9.30 – 12.00noon: Patients - wards

PRIDAY SATURDAY 30

12 – 1.00pm: Lunch and Office work (notes, etc.)

1.00 – 2.00pm: Visit laboratory, kitchen & pharmacy

2.00 - 5.00pm: Clinics, group sessions, family therapy

The environment:

- Large, busy, multi-disciplinary office
- Autonomous, exact, challenging
- Quick thinking and able to manage your own time





Is mental health for you?

- Can be challenging
- Many barriers to behaviour change
- Longer stay = able to build relationships
- Multidisciplinary team working
- Fascinating / rewarding
- Motivational interviewing, cognitive behavioural therapy
- Look for volunteer opportunities







My Journey continued...

- If moving overseas, begin registration process before you go
- Link with professional networks and international agencies.


